

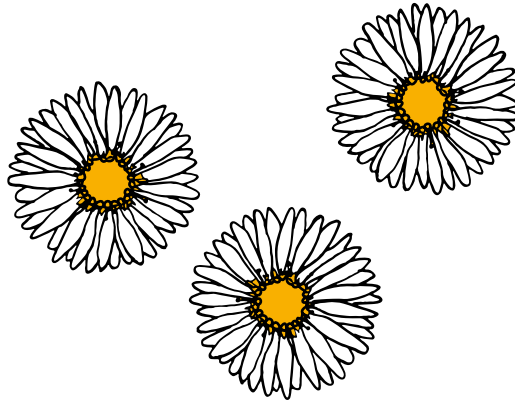


Make your own bunch of cheerful paper daisies – or use your blooms to decorate cards and gifts!

Crazy Daisies

You'll need...

- Coloured paper
- Green paper straws
- Scissors
- Gluestick
- Sticky tape



Did you know...

...the oxeye daisy is our largest native daisy with each flower being 3-5cm wide.

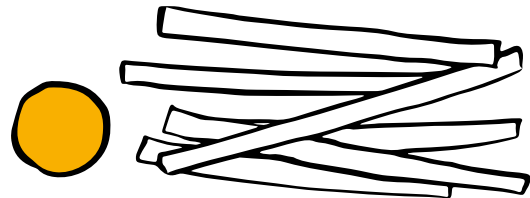
1: Cut out a circle of yellow paper (drawing round a £2 coin is a good size!) for the centre of the flower.

2: Next cut around 20 strips of white paper each 5-10mm wide by 100mm long.

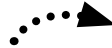
3: Take each strip and curve it over on itself so the two ends meet - use your glue stick to join the ends together. These are the petals.

4: Use your glue stick again to attach the petals to the back of the yellow circle, spacing them out as evenly as you can.

5: Next, use some sticky tape to attach one end of the paper straw to the back of the flower. Make lots more and you'll have a bonny bouquet of everlasting daisies to enjoy!
