Summary of Land Management Plan Proposals

Bartaggart is an establishing woodland planted in 2014. Covering 65.18 ha, the area comprises of a mix of productive and native broadleaves and open space, including an area of restored bog. The Bartaggart Land Management Plan (LMP) will replace and renew the previous plan, defining the management prescription for the next ten year period (between 2021-31) and presents the vision for the long-term management of the area. The main management objectives in this small scale plan will focus on biodiversity, environmental quality, and sustainable timber production.
