

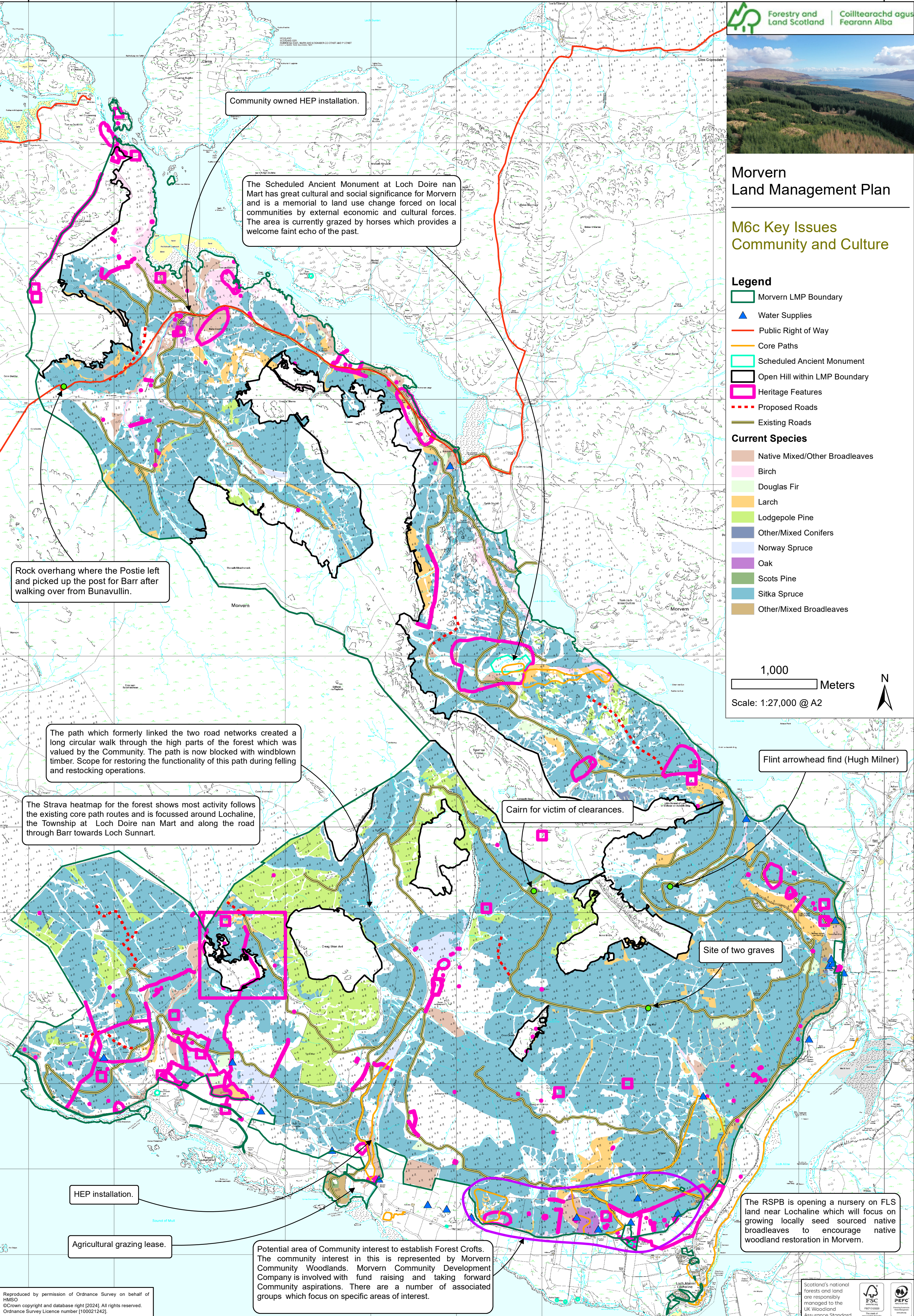
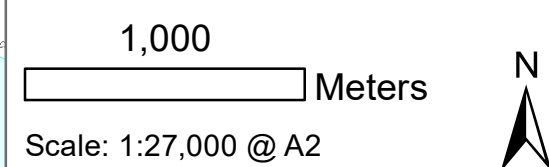


Morvern Land Management Plan

The Scheduled Ancient Monument at Loch Doire nan Mart has great cultural and social significance for Morvern and is a memorial to land use change forced on local communities by external economic and cultural forces. The area is currently grazed by horses which provides a welcome faint echo of the past.

The path which formerly linked the two road networks created a long circular walk through the high parts of the forest which was valued by the Community. The path is now blocked with windblown timber. Scope for restoring the functionality of this path during felling and restocking operations.

The Strava heatmap for the forest shows most activity follows the existing core path routes and is focussed around Lochaline, the Township at Loch Doire nan Mart and along the road through Barr towards Loch Sunnart.

Potential area of Community interest to establish Forest Crofts. The community interest in this is represented by Morvern Community Woodlands. Morvern Community Development Company is involved with fund raising and taking forward Community aspirations. There are a number of associated groups which focus on specific areas of interest.

The RSPB is opening a nursery on FLS land near Lochaline which will focus on growing locally seed sourced native broadleaves to encourage native woodland restoration in Morvern.
