

The open ground comprises largely acid grassland and upland heath. Dominant heather stands are limited but bilberry and associated shrubs are commonplace. There are extensive areas of scattered regeneration of both conifers and broadleaves across all open ground areas and this extends to 600m in sheltered areas. The upland areas are grazed by deer and marauding sheep, but no formal agricultural activity occurs on the hill ground. A number of rough pastures occur along the lower part of the Strath and these are grazed by agricultural tenants.

Felling operations are ongoing within these areas of standing crop.
