Users of recreation areas on both sides of Loch Lomond will have long-term benefits from the management decisions within the next 10 years as one of the world's rarest habitats is re-established.

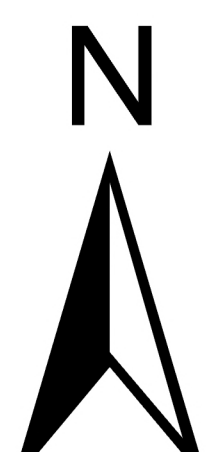
Disruption to extremely popular visitor areas to be kept to a minimum and engagement with the public is to be a top priority regarding operations.
