Summary of Land Management Plan Proposals

Bellamore is located near Pinwherry, South Ayrshire and is immediately adjacent to the White Clauchrie forest block, with the privately held forests of Glake and Knockodhar lying to the northeast and northwest. It is part of Scotland's national forests and land owned by Scotlish Ministers on behalf of the people of Scotland and managed by Forestry and Land Scotland (FLS).

The main management objectives in this plan focus on sustainable timber production, native woodland retention and expansion, the protection and enhancement of priority habitats, and carbon sequestration.
