

Potential for land exchange between FCS & JHI. If the land is acquired from JHI the intention would be to expand native broadleaved area by planting the fields acquired. JHI would take on an equivalent area of woodland grazing in exchange. This area will provide shelter and facilitate access for grazing the wider LRB area to control re-generation.

These areas of mixed broadleaves and native broadleaves will be managed sensitively by gradually removing non-native species in favour of successive native species.

This area will allow expansion of native woodland and will be monitored for creep towards LRB. Re-generation of MC will be controlled.

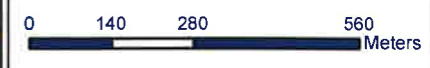

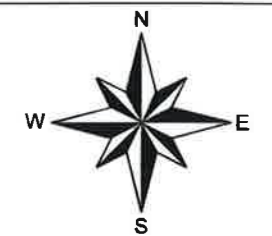
