

Summary of Land Management Plan Proposals

Cologin Forest lies 2 miles south of Oban. The forest was planted in the 1980's, a forest walking route introduced, but no forest road access was provided, resulting in restructuring being overdue. Following the purchase of Ariogan by FLS in 2023, a new access will be built through this area to access Cologin. Commercial conifers have grown exceptionally well. Oban's public water supply reservoir lies immediately adjacent to the forest and is an important consideration, aswell as a number of private water supplies.

The primary objectives for the plan area are; commercial conifer timber production, access provision for timber haulage, protection of water supplies, landscape enhancement, plant health resilience and bog restoration. Landscape reappraisal, particularly in views from the A816, is necessary, considering guidance on tree species resilience and diversification in response to climate change. Certification under the UK Woodland Assurance Scheme is another important objective to which the plan will contribute.


