### Map 1 – Location Tannylaggie:

- Grid reference: NX 2796 6980

### Map 2 – Key Features DRAFT Tannylaggie 2026-2036:

- FLS Kilgallioch Forest Block.
- FLS Penninghame Forest Block.
- FLS Knock of Luce Forest Block.
- Blood Moss SSSI - Designated for priority blanket bog open habitat. Favourably maintained.
- Kirkcowan Flow SSSI - Designated for blanket bog (Unfavorable Recovering).
- Ongoing peatland restoration of Kilquhockadale Flow.
- Airies Wind Farm (Active).
- Kilquhockadale New Woodland Creation – Native species.
- High recreational use within this end of the block. Core path and trails. Views onto Fell Hill and Knockalanny Hill from Three Lochs Holiday Park, Black Loch (recreational fishing) and from the public road.
- River Bladnoch SAC (Polbae Burn, Dargoals Burn, Pultayan and Tarf Water) - Designated for Atlantic Salmon.
- Acid sensitive catchment - Scallop shell road project carried out in the north of the block in partnership with Galloway Fisheries Trust.
- Water supply points present within the block - Will be ground truthed.

#### **DRAFT Key management objectives for Tannylaggie Long Term Plan 2026-2036**

1. Sustainable timber production.
2. Continued peatland restoration.
3. Structure and species diversity.
4. Continued management of the Blood Moss SSSI and River Bladnoch SAC as per Designated Site Management Plans.

**Objective 1. Sustainable timber production**

- Continue to sustainably support the regional felling and restock programmes.
- Establish forest road access to isolated coupes.

**Objectives 2. & 4. Habitat**

- Continue forest to bog conversion of Kilquhockadale Flow to benefit the neighbouring Kirkcowan Flow SSSI.
- Medium to long-term: Monitor and maintain restored sites.
- Potential to extend restoration efforts north, linking with Blood Moss SSSI and benefiting the River Bladnoch SAC.

**Objective 3. Structure and species diversity**

- Maintain a diverse woodland via a range of management types now and in the future.
- This will benefit forest structure, biodiversity, visitor experience and forest views.
- Establishment of Kilquhockadale new woodland creation will improve species diversity within the block.
