#### How to get here

Lemahamish car park is signposted off the quiet B-road between Cobleland Campsite and Gartmore Village.

Follow the forest road downhill and take a right at the forest cross road junction to reach the car park.

#### Trail Information



##### Riverside Trail ○○○

A relaxed stroll through beautiful mixed woodland beside the River Forth. Stop for a spot of forest bathing, or relax with a picnic.

**Firm but uneven surface with some muddy sections and exposed roots.**

**Generally flat with some gentle slopes. Can be prone to surface flooding after heavy rain.**

##### Easter Park Trail ●●●

A charming walk along the meandering River Forth and through the native oak woods of Easter Park. In spring there are bluebells and in autumn an array of fungi.

**Sections of uneven earthy and rocky path with extensive muddy parts after heavy rain. Some fairly steep slopes. Includes a section of uneven tree roots and some low hanging branches.**

### Doon Hill Trail ●●●

Climb to the top of Doon Hill to find a solitary Scots pine amongst the oaks. It is thought to mark the entrance to a Fairy Queen's underground palace.

Uneven gravel path

exposed tree roots.
