## Callander Land Management Plan 2016-2026 Summary of Proposals

Callander Land Management Plan area is adjacent to the town after which it is named and is split into two distinct units either side of the River Teith (see location map). The woodlands are situated on the Highland Boundary Fault, and Callander Crags form an impressive backdrop to the town. The mix of conifer and broadleaved woodland are set against a rugged mountain landscape when viewed from the south. The key objectives for Callander emphasise the importance of recreation and landscape. Clearfelling will deal with recent wind damaged stands and restocking will be with a mix of conifers and broadleaved species. Management options for 48.2ha of Balameanoch wood remain under review and approval was not sought for management of this area.
