

The forest falls within the Stepped Basalt Landscape Character Type (Naturescot).  
 Key Features:  
 Dark basalt cliffs with stepped slope profile.  
 Exposed basalt rock faces separating wide terraces of grass or heather.  
 Extensive forestry in sheltered glens.  
 Tracts of broadleaved woodland on inaccessible slopes.  
 Historical features.  
 Views across sounds and narrows emphasising dramatic cliff profiles of eroded stacks and arches.

AGLV landscape designation to the North of boundary

Open, medium distance views of stepped landscape with cliffs from minor road.

Close range views of the NE forest edge from the minor road.

This steep ridge and the associated forestry covered crags have a high visual impact for travellers approaching from the north on A884.

Long distance and open views from the A849/A844 on Mull and from ships, boats and ferries passing along the Sound of Mull.

Close range views along the South and East forest edge from the B849 and A844.
