



## Accessible text from Map 3: Concept

Text begins from uppermost box at the top right of the map working clockwise.

- Maintain the visitor experience by managing a diversity of woodland types and open ground, offering views both within and out from the forest.
- Use sheltered areas and good soils as an opportunity to grow alternative conifers for quality timber products
- Explore opportunities to create new ponds and wetland in the valley, in association with wet woodland
- Ensure forest design responds to landform and contributes positively to the special qualities of the National Scenic Area
- Clear windblown trees in Phase 1 (years 1-5) to recover timber - and open up blocked core path
- Expand native broadleaf woodland by connecting existing areas along riparian zones and linking to surrounding woodland.
- Ensure the Tornat PAWS areas are regenerating and establishing as native woodland - enrichment plant if required
- Protect the heronry by leaving these trees as long term retention
